Second Chances for Rescued Horses and Incarcerated Volunteers

The MSSPA's equine assisted learning program gives incarcerated women from the Southern Maine Women's Re-entry Center and recovering horses an opportunity to learn from one another. The innovative

program is designed to give the SMWRC residents the skills and experience they need to transition from state correctional facilities into their home communities. The self-confidence and empathy they gain from working with the rescued horses alongside Society staff and community volunteers supports successful reintegration.

An average of 50 women participate in the program each year and, on any given

day, there can be as many as eight volunteers from the SMWRC at the horse shelter, helping to ensure that all tasks are completed, including cleaning stalls and grooming horses.


Adopt from MSSPA

After years of planning and months of construction, MSSPA proudly presented the completed equine training and rehabilitation facility at its Welcome Weekend celebration in October 2018. Since then, thousands of visitors, including many first-time guests and new supporters, have toured the horse shelter. MSSPA has hosted dozens of birthday parties, club meetings, and community groups in our spectacular new space.

The equine training arena includes a vet exam and wash stall, tack room, and ondeck stall. The Keddy-Goodreau arena facilitates the safe training and handling of MSSPA horses year-round.

Help MSSPA welcome the newest member of the herd – Daphne's colt!

After a naming contest, which produced 175 name suggestions, and thorough consideration by the MSSPA Board, the foal's name was revealed.

Meet Windy River

Daphne, a sadly neglected young mare, was rescued with three other horses by an animal control officer in Southern Maine in July 2018. She was feral, ill from a heavy parasite load, infested with lice, and in need of dental and hoof care. She couldn't be easily caught or touched. She was also suffering from a dangerous, painful abdominal hernia. Daphne underwent surgery, requiring general anesthesia; only afterward was pregnancy suspected.

Blood testing confirmed the young mare was in foal. Delivery date? Due to hormonal fluctuation, it was anyone's guess. Then . . .

MSSPA staff welcomed this brown-eyed, bay baby boy to the world at 8:52 pm on Friday, March 1, 2019. At 10 hands high and just about 100 lbs, Windy River is the first foal born at the Society's River Road farm in Windham in over 20 years.


Please note that this is not a riding camp; campers may have direct interaction with the horses, including grooming, but riding will not be offered.
